

# Cannon, Daniels 2-way all-district choices

Broadmoor's Billy Cannon Jr. and Lee High's Eugene Daniels are the only players making the 6-AAAA Coaches' All-District first units on both offense and defense.

Coaches were allowed to nominate their own players but not to vote for them. All of

the district's schools were represented at the selection meeting except St. Amant.

Cannon was also named the outstanding offensive player, while a teammate, senior tackle Lindsey Cooper, was designated the district's outstanding defensive player.

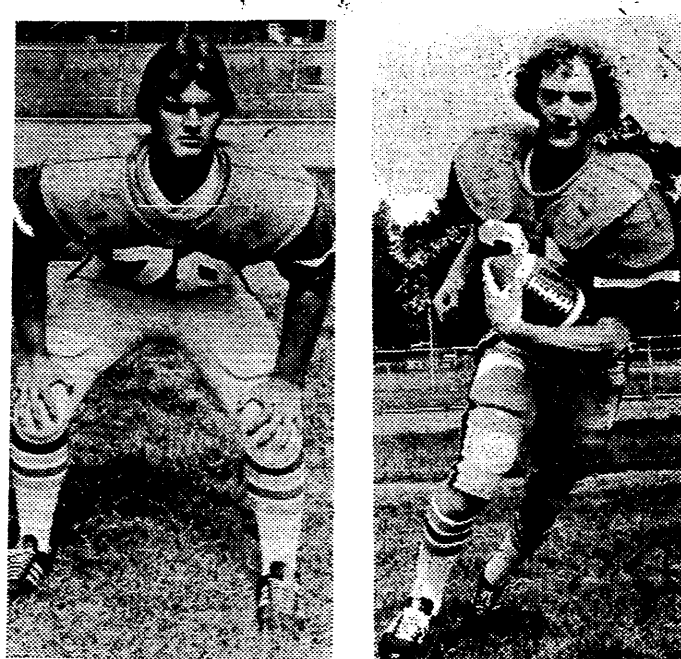
Coach-of-the-Year honors went to East Ascension's Joe Clark, who edged

Broadmoor's Bob Carter. Clark's team regrouped from an 0-4 start to challenge for a playoff berth.

Besides Cannon and Cooper, Broadmoor, which enjoyed the first 10-0 season in its history and was the state's top-ranked Quad-A team, claimed five other positions on the team. Included were offensive tackles Bob Horton and Steve Schexnayder, offensive guard Fabian Roussel, center Jimmy Gibson and defensive end Gary Mall.

Lee High claimed the second highest number of representatives with five, including Daniels (twice), offensive guard Don Major, offensive back Ricky Stewart and defensive tackle Andre Scott.

Istrouma has four positions on the all-district, including offensive back Elton Veals, defensive end Drew Landry, nose guard Tim Mallet and defensive back Casey Howard. Veals also made the second team on defense as did Howard on offense.

McKinley tight end Kevin Jackson and Tara split end Jay Simmons, both juniors, complete the first offensive team. Linebackers Stanley Williams, another junior from Capitol; EA's Johnny DeArmond and Tara's Danny Gomez were the other defensive selections on the first team.

Jackson caught 28 passes for 350 yards

and four touchdowns and Simmons grabbed 16 for 326 yards and two scores.

Horton graded 88 percent at offensive tackle and Schexnayder was another outstanding blocker for Broadmoor, clearing the way for running backs Cannon, Bill Ashby and Kevin Kelley.

Roussel graded 82 percent and Major 91 percent as offensive guards, and Gibson scored at 85 percent at center.

Daniels won the quarterback spot over Capitol's Bennie Stewart by a 4-2 margin with the other vote going to Tara's Kevin Darouse. Daniels rushed for 562 yards, had a 6.1 average and scored eight touchdowns, one on a punt return. He also passed for 877 yards and seven touchdowns. On defense Daniels made 38 tackles, intercepted seven passes and had three sacks.

Cannon, who scored 19 touchdowns, three on punt returns, led all rushers on the team with 785 yards and 6.5 average. He also caught 23 passes for 322 yards. Defensively, Cannon intercepted four passes to bring his career total to 17, made 25 solo tackles and assisted on 10.

Stewart rushed for 712 yards and averaged 7.1 a carry. He scored seven touchdowns. Veals rushed for 757 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 210-pound senior also completed two passes for 58 yards and a score.

Moving on to defense, Mall showed 29 tackles, 10 assists, intercepted a pass and sacked opposing backs four times for a team that did not use its first defense in the second half of its last four games. Landry made 31 individual tackles, 9 assists, two sacks and four interceptions for Istrouma. He also averaged 31.9 on 40 punts.

Cooper had 42 solos, 35 assists, blocked two punts, recovered a fumble and had 10 sacks. Scott, the other defensive tackle, won his position in a runoff with Plain after they tied earlier. Scott had 57 tackles, including 15 sacks and recovered two fumbles.

Nose guard Mallet, a 200-pound junior, made 60 solo stops, assisted 41 times, recovered five fumbles, caused five, blocked a pass and had four sacks.

Of the linebackers Williams made 76 tackles, aided on 19 others and recovered two fumbles. DeArmond figured in 93 tackles and is the only member of his team on the first units. Gomez made 101 tackles, aided 35 times, caused three fumbles and had seven sacks.

Beside Cannon and Daniels the third member of the defensive secondary is Istrouma's Howard who was an unanimous pick as was Cannon on offense but not on defense. Howard returned two of eight intercepted passes for touchdowns, made 46 individual tackles, recovered two fumbles and was credited with four "big plays."

## Three quad-A teams finish unbeaten in regular season

Several teams, including the respective leaders, Broadmoor in Quad-A, St. James in Triple-A, St. Louis in Double-A and Pointe Coupee Catholic in Single-A, in the final Louisiana Sports Writers Association poll, enjoyed 10-0 records during the regular season.

Also finishing the regular season 10-0 were Quad-A's Sulphur and New Iberia, Triple-A's Plaquemine, Double-A's Kinder, Patterson and St. Helena, and Single-A's Port Sulphur and Oak Grove. Gilbert, another Class A team, went 9-0 and allowed only seven points, by 3-A rival Sicily Island, which had a 52-game district winning streak snapped by Gilbert's 14-7 win.

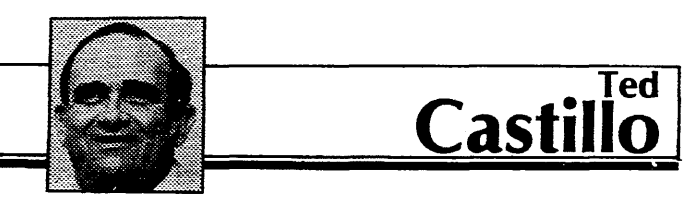

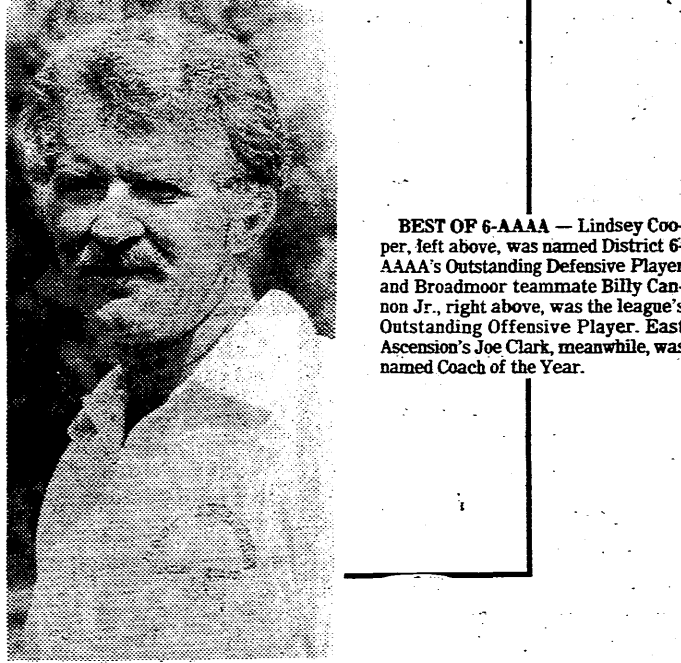
