Stewart rushed for 712 yards and averaged 7.1 a carry. He scored seven touchdowns. Veals rushed for 757 yards and 10 touchdowns. The 210-pound senior also completed two passes for 58 yards and




Nose guard Mallet, a 200-pound junior. made 60 solo stops, assisted 41 times, recovered five fumbles, caused five,


