Belaire High coaches Dale Ketelsen and Barrett Murphy aren't ones to take their work home with them. But when it comes to events like Saturday's Belaire-Catholic High wrestling match, reminders are

waiting at the supper table.

For friendly banter about the match is a natural aperitif at both households, where the coaches are from Belaire and the wrestlers from Catholic. There's CHS wrestlers Craig in the Ketelsen home and Brett and Greg at the Murphys'.

And when a match is as close as the one

Saturday at BHS is expected to be, such gibes are as thick as cauliflower dressing. Mat action begins at 1:30 p.m.

Craig Ketelsen, a senior for the

Grizzlies, is recovering from a broken finger and won't be in the starting lineup, but Brett and Greg Murphy are integral parts of coach Bobby Navo's plans to retain wrestling supremacy. On the local scene, Belaire is expected to give Catholic a stern challenge in a few weeks when the Bears defend their city championship.

Both Belaire coach Ketelsen and Catholic mentor Navo expressed mixed feelings about their teams' performances at last week's Belaire Invitational, where New Orleans teams carted off most of the top awards.

No team titles were at stake in that meet, but Belaire beat Catholic earlier in the season in the Brusly Tournament. Catholic won the prestigious Big Eight. Tournament in New Orleans recently, a tourney which annually pits the top eight teams from last year's state finals in an early-season warmup. Belaire wasn't in the Big Eight meet.

Each team had one champion in the Belaire Invite, the host Bengals getting the heavyweight medal with Darryl Boudreaux and the Grizzlies taking the 155-pound title with Scott Deumite.

Both wrestlers head a flock of seniors on both sides who figure to set the pace Saturday. Joining Boudreaux for Belaire will be Kevin Tabor at 145 pounds and Loren Smith at 112, while coach Navo's challenge will lead with Deumite. who has won 20 matches this season without a loss, 132-pound Lenny Cardenas, who is 13-1, and soph Brett Murphy at 126.

Both Ketelsen and Navo agree the match will be close, and a good indicator of how much of a challenge each team will make on city, regional and state competition later this month and next.

I think both we and Catholic are

contenders for state this year. Right now, everyone is about the same as far as physical conditioning goes. Technique and desire will be the deciding factors as to who wins from here on to state," notes Keteisen

And the Belaire mentor, who has pioneered wrestling on the local level both as head coach at LSU and as an assistant to Murphy at Catholic High before both moved to Belaire, says wrestling around Baton Rouge is fast reaching parity with New Orleans, long-time leader of the sport in the state.

"I have mixed feelings about the city championship. I know it was started when Baton Rouge teams couldn't compete with New Orleans. And although city titles have their place, we should be thinking bigger now, toward winning the big prizes at

state," Ketelsen says. Everything about wrestling, which Ketelsen has coached at BHS for two years, is encouraging. "Ultimately," Ketelsen adds, "We'll know the sport has 'arrived' when high schools in the state can supply teams like LSU with wrestlers who compete in the Southeastern

The sport is booming and can only go up. It's a low-cost sport, since schools already have a gym. Coach Murphy really got things moving at Belaire when he bought mats on a three-year plan three years ago. With revenues we've gotten from the fans, we've about paid for the

"Wrestling has taken its place as a regular varsity sport. More kids are getting interested every year, and in our case the administration is 100 percent behind it. It is especially appealing to kids who at 90 or 100 pounds are too little for football and basketball, and it's also an excellent conditioner for football players in off-season," says Ketelsen.
