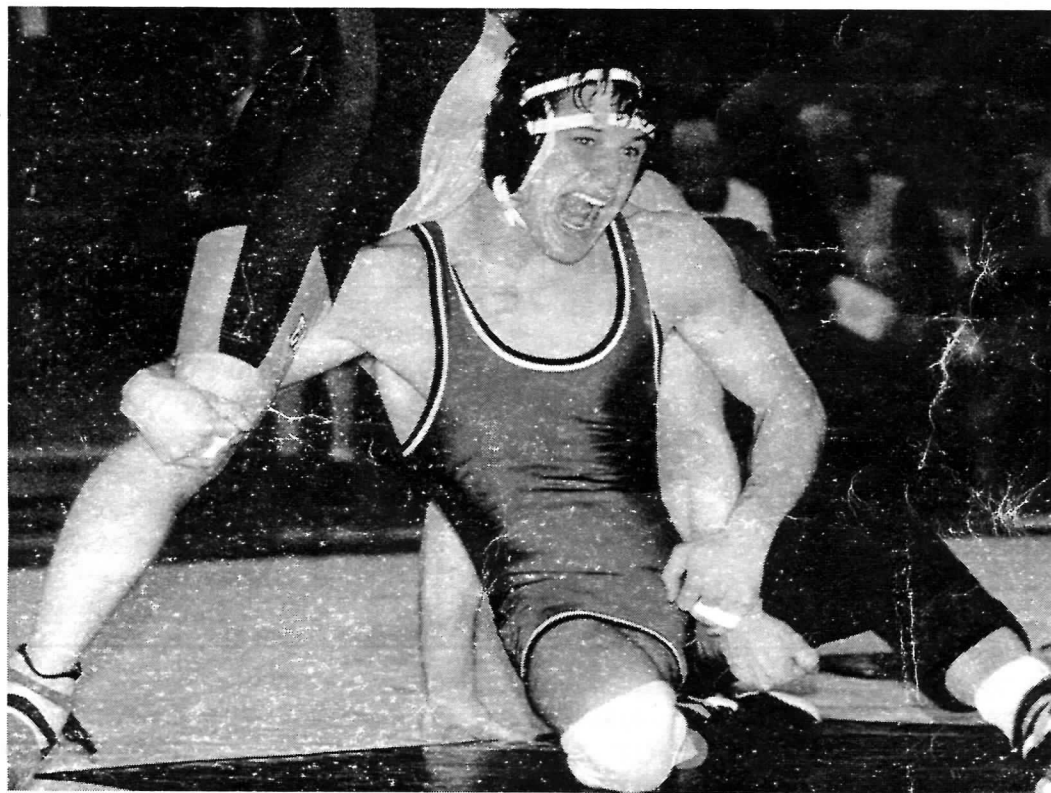

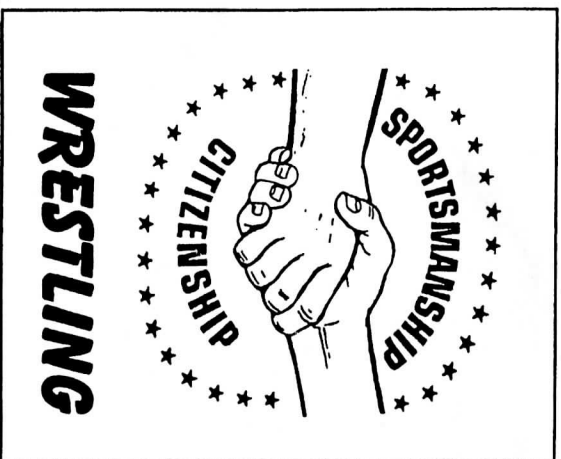

A Message From The Tournament Director

It is my pleasure to welcome all wrestlers, coaches and wrestling fans to the 25th Annual Lee High Invitational Wrestling Tournament. I apologize for the tight quarters and inconvenience *but* without a doubt you will see some of the finest high school wrestling the state has to offer. This year 41 teams will participate over the two day weekend with close to 600 matches being wrestled. Three Lee champs will be back to defend their titles of a year ago. One, Matt Orillion of Jesuit was a Lee winner in 1996 was a finalist last year and will be shooting for his second title. There are only five wrestlers to win Lee three times. Five Division I and seven Division II State Champion wrestlers are entered in this years tournament and will be competing along with a host of outstanding young wrestlers.

This is the oldest invitational wrestling tournament in Louisiana and has become one of the the most prestigious meets in the state. Year in and year out Lee winners go on to capture individual (eleven last year) and team titles at the state championships to be held later in the season. Last years Lee champion Jesuit High School, won its tenth consecutive title.

The team title, based on the top four seeds, should be Jesuit High School coached by Sam Harnsongkram. The Blue Jays have eleven of the top four seeded wrestlers in the tournament followed by six for Brother Martin and Hoover of Hoover Alabama with five. The meet is filled with outstanding wrestlers in every weight class. Nine wrestlers are undefeated and might find a few surprises along the way.

Probably one of the most interesting weight classes will be the 275's as the top three seeds are all without a lost for the season. **Roxie Shelvin** of Franklin had all falls last season and eleven of his twelve wins this season are by the pin. Another good matchup should be two-time state champ **Roderick Ratcliff** of McKinley and possibly **Eddie Webb** of Lafayette. They have had some great battles in the past.

At 112 **Kris Louviere** of Lafayette and **Brian Menendez** haven't met this year and if they do it should be a great match to watch as both only have one loss each.

Another wrestler to keep an eye on is Baton Rouge's **Andy Chapman** who hasn't had his best tournaments at Lee. He has lost the last two years in the semi's and has never gotten to the victory stand. This year standing in his way is **Byron Pogue** of Brother Martin with his unblemished record of 19 wins. Also down in the lowest weight class, 103, **David Wagner** of McKinley is at the top of the heap with an 18-0 record.

Brother Martin's **Hiram Greer** is one of the most physical wrestlers in the tournament this year and his 22-0 record proves it. **Greer** was a state champion two years ago as a sophomore and the senior is looking like he never missed a beat.

First seed at 125 pounds is Brusly's **Barrett Wilson** another wrestler without a loss this year. **Wilson** was a finalist last year at Lee and has two Division II state titles to his credit.

Madison Carville will wrestle for St. John this year after being on the Catholic High team in the past. **Carville** brings with his a 16-1 record only losing to second seed **Harold Cage** of Capitol.

Hoover High School has six wrestlers in the seeded positions with the highest seed (2nd) going to 3rd place finisher at Lee a year ago Kevin Miller with a 22-0 record.

Remember A Year Ago

The 24th Annual Lee High Invitational saw Jesuit High School walk away with their thirteenth title while setting a team tournament record of 280.5 points over New Orleans rival Brother Martin. Thirteen out of fourteen first seeds reached the finals with eleven winning championships. Some great matches were wrestled throughout the tournament with the finals dominated by the upset victory by Rummel's Chad Ritchie over undefeated two-time Lee winner Patrick Luke of Hanson. For his efforts Ritchie was named the tournament's outstanding wrestler. Chad Boudreaux, also of Rummel, won his third title becoming only the fifth wrestler in 24 years to do so with his second period pin in the finals. Eleven wrestlers entered the tournament undefeated with only six wrestlers keeping their streaks alive. Jesuit, coached by Sam Harnsongkram, placed seven wrestlers in the finals but only two won titles. The Blue Jays went on to win the Louisiana State Championship four weeks later.

The action started off in the 103 pound weight class as first seed Garrett Gremillion of Jesuit took down Leon Ngchee to lead 2-0, but the Grace King wrestler escaped quickly and with a single leg takedown led 3-2 at the end of the first period. Ngchee chose top to start the second period. Gremillion escaped, but Ngchee again got a takedown. Gremillion escaped again and quickly secured a double leg takedown to lead 6-5 as they went out of bounds. Ngchee quickly scored a reversal with a switch and went for the fall but didn't score back points. Gremillion stood up for an escape to tie the score at 7-7. In the third period Gremillion was on top and went for a cradle but slipped off, and Ngchee scored a reversal for the lead 9-7. Gremillion escaped again to tighten the score 9-8. With 55 seconds left, Ngchee scored with a double leg and worked the bar arm till time ran out for a 11-8 win.

At 112 pounds Jesuit's Creighton Mullins wasted little time in taking down Wyman Alligood and securing the fall at 1:32 in the first period. Mullins, the number one seed wrestling Buras's number two seed, took down Alligood in 47 seconds and went straight to a half nelson at the edge of the mat and worked to keep Alligood in bounds for the fall and his first Lee title.

The match at 119 pounds had two-time champion Patrick Luke of Hanson going against the third seed Patrick Ritchie of Rummel. The first period ended with the score tied 2 all as Luke took down Richie with a high crotch to a double leg. Luke put in the legs but was riding too low on the hips when Richie stepped over for the reversal at the buzzer to tie the score at 2-2. Richie choose neutral to start the second period and got a takedown, but with 30 seconds remaining in the period Luke sat out and turned in for a reversal. Luke chose down to start the third period but Richie went with the optional start and let Luke up for an escape. Richie hit a duck-under to a body lock for a takedown with 37 seconds left. Luke worked to free himself from the legs that Richie threw in but to no avail as Richie won his first Lee title with his upset victory of Patrick Luke 6-5.

The number one and two seeds faced off in the 125 pound finals. Logan Dore` of Catholic High came into the match with 23 wins and no losses and faced junior Barrett Wilson of Brusly with a 18-3 record. After a scoreless first period Dore` had the choice and took down to start the second period. Wilson got too high with his crossbody ride, and Dore' slipped out the back door for a reversal and the lead at 2-0. Wilson quickly sat out and escaped for one point. The second period ended with the score 2-1, Dore`. Five seconds into the third period Wilson escaped to tie the score at 2-2. Dore` shot a single leg and held on for the takedown with 1:20 left in the period to go up 4-2. Wilson gramby rolled for an escape to tighten the score 4-3. Dore` ducked under an attempted head throw for another takedown and the 6-3 win.

Roderick Ratcliff, McKinley's undefeated state champion and number one seed (17-0), squared off with the second seed from Brother Martin, sophomore David Pearson. Ratcliff, a finalist a year ago shot right at the buzzer but didn't get any points and the score was 0-0 at the end of the first period. Ratcliff used the optional start and let Pearson up for an escape but came back with a takedown to go ahead 2-1. Ratcliff let Pearson up again and scored another takedown to lead 5-2 and again let Pearson go for one point to lead 5-3. The third period saw Ratcliff use his quickness and takedown ability to wear down Pearson and win 14-8. Ratcliff scored six takedowns during the match.

Two-time Lee Champion Chad Boudreaux of Rummel got into the finals with two pins, a disqualification and a technical fall. Justin Meunier, a seventh seed junior from Jesuit, upset the second seed in the quarter-finals to advance to the finals. Meunier attempted a throw which Boudreaux countered and got the takedown. Then

Boudreaux let Meunier up for the escape. Boudreaux, a two-time state champ, came right back with a fireman's carry and put Meunier on his back for three points as the first period ended 7-1. Boudreaux escaped to start the period and got a takedown, gave up an escape, and got his fourth takedown of the match with a duck-under to a body lock to a fall in 2:39. Boudreaux became only the fifth wrestler in 24 years to win three titles.

Defending champ Jacob Gruwell of Brother Martin was seeded fourth at the start of the meet but defeated the number one seed in the semi's to reach the finals. He faced a powerful third seeded sophomore in Mark Delesdernier of Jesuit who upset the number two seed in the semi's to reach the finals. Gruwell, a state champion, scored the first two points and then gave up the escape to lead 2-1 at the end of the first period. Delesdernier, on top to start the second period, got too low with his legs in and Gruwell stepped over for the reversal. Delesdernier stood up and scored an escape. Gruwell then countered Delesdernier's overhook with a throw at the edge of the mat for a takedown and a 6-2 lead. Gruwell gave up an escape with the optional start then snapped down and spun behind Delesdernier for a takedown to lead 8-3. Gruwell couldn't turn Delesdernier, so he let him up for one point then came right back with another takedown. At the end of the period Delesdernier escaped but to no avail as Gruwell won 10-5.

At 145 pounds Jesuit's number one seed senior, Jason Leckert, took on the third seed in Buras' Josh Friedman. Friedman, a junior, got a takedown at the edge of the mat and went in with the legs and got too high. Leckert slipped out the back door for a reversal and quickly went to a half nelson before the match was stopped for an injury timeout. When action was resumed, Leckert wasted little time in going for the cradle and the fall in 1:44 of the first period for Jesuit's second title of the night.

The number one and two seeds met in the finals of the 152 pound weight class as undefeated junior Josh Fontenot of Bishop Sullivan took on sophomore Trey Landry of Jesuit. Landry jumped out ahead 5-0 with a single leg takedown and a cradle before Fontenot escaped and got a takedown to narrow the score 5-3 at the end of the first period. In the second period Fontenot worked a bar to a half nelson for a 2 point near-fall to tie the score 5-5. In the third period Fontenot was awarded a point for Landry locking hands. Fontenot then switched for 2 points and after a great scramble caught Landry on his back and pinned the Blue Jay in 5:17 for Bishop Sullivan's first Lee title.

At 160 Catholic's Dennis Parker defended his Lee title against another Lee winner, Jesuit's Matt Orillion. Parker was undefeated at 27-0 and started quickly as he caught Orillion with an ankle pick in the first 10 seconds of the match. Parker then went straight into a crossbody ride working for a turk or guillotine, then with just seconds to go, threw on a cradle, got his legs out and rolled through to put Orillion on his back for 2 points. Orillion chose neutral to start the second period and got in on a single leg, but Parker somehow worked his way free and scored on a duck-under for a takedown. Orillion gramby rolled for a reversal and back points to narrow the score to 6-4. Then Parker escaped for 1 point. In the third period Parker escaped again to lead 8-4 and got the final takedown to win his second title 10-4.

In the 171 pound finals Murry Honore' of McKinley took on junior Bryan Seymour of Brusly. Honore' came into the finals with a 31-1 record and countered most of Seymour's shots with takedowns and then just letting Seymour up for the escapes. During the match Honore' accumulated 10 takedowns while giving up 9 escapes. This was Honore's first Lee title.

Daniel Cormier, a two-time state champ from Northside, was another wrestler defending his title of a year ago when he met the sixth seeded Ken Kiefer of Brother Martin. Cormier registered five falls in the tournament and started with a double leg takedown straight to his opponent's back for five points. Cormier then let Kiefer up twice while scoring a near-fall and two takedowns to lead 11-3 at the end of the first period. The second period Cormier escaped and got two more takedowns before pinning Kiefer in 3:02 for his second title.

Junior Roxie Shelvin of Franklin, who had a record of 21-0 with 21 falls, took Fred Patterson of Grace King down to his back for five points before the match was stopped for a violation. Shelvin let Patterson up for an escape then took him down again to lead at the end of the first period 7-2. Shelvin chose the neutral position then countered a leg shot by Patterson, spun behind for the takedown, then put in a half nelson for the pin and the win at 3:53.

The 275 pound weight class had Keith Tomlinson of Rummel versus Trey Culotta, a state champion from Brother Martin. In the first period Tomlinson scored two takedowns and gave Culotta two escapes to lead 4-2. Tomlinson chose bottom and rolled Culotta for a two point reversal then gave him the escape and scored two more takedowns along with a near-fall to lead the match 12-5. In the third period Culotta escaped, and Tomlinson got a takedown and pinned Culotta in 5:10.

TOURNAMENT HISTORY—1973 - 1997

The initial Lee High Invitational Wrestling Tournament started in 1973 with nine schools participating. The original concept was to host a one day meet whereby a wrestler could wrestle his three matches and be home that same night. The one day tournament lasted for seven years, but, because of the number of teams entered, the meet was extended to two days. Jesuit High School of New Orleans, the defending State Champions, coached by Sam Harnsongkram, won the first tournament by 54 points over second place Lee High and Bishop Kelly (Tulsa, OK), which were tied with 83.5 points each. Jesuit, at that time, had a 51-1 dual meet record and was just beginning its dominance in the State in wrestling. The Blue Jays placed nine men in the finals and six won titles lead by senior, 126 pounder, **Mike Gaffney**, who was selected by the coaches as the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. **Rick Torczynski** of Bishop Kelly pulled the upset of the day with his third period fall of defending State Champion, **John Malone** of Jesuit in the finals.

The 1974 tournament had eight teams and was a double elimination tournament with points being scored for all eight places. Defending tournament champion, Jesuit, left after the consolation finals because of a discrepancy with the officials. Jesuit, who was in third place when they left, forfeited their team points and had two wrestlers in the finals. Host team, Lee High, had six wrestlers advance to the finals, but none could win a title. Lee, edged Holy Cross by a half point 98 to 97.5 without a single champion. This was the closest margin of victory ever by a winning team. Holy Cross had four individual champions and the Outstanding Wrestler in 155 pounder, **Keith Hosli**.

The third annual tournament in 1975 saw a scrappy Jesuit team come from ten points behind Holy Cross going into the finals and emerge a 74.5 to 70.5 winner. In the 105 pound finals, **Arthur Dupre** of Jesuit secured a third period fall to pick up four valuable team points. **John Holahan**, 112 pound teammate, scored late in the final period to gain a tie and go into overtime with **John Campbell** of Holy Cross. Holahan came back with a 8-0 overtime victory to pull his team within three points of the Tigers of Holy Cross. Jesuit then picked up wins at 145 pounds from **Mike Morales** and at 155 pounds from **Mark Diluzio** to nail down

their team title.

In 1976 Jesuit, the defending State and Invitational Champs, was the team to beat from the outset of the tournament. The powerful Blue Jays rolled over the competition and finished 56 points ahead of Rummel to take their third title in four years. Holy Cross' 185 pounder, **Roy DeRoche's**, decision over previously undefeated **Jeff Tanguis** of Catholic earned him his first title and the Outstanding Wrestler award.

1977 saw no change in the tournament champion as Jesuit won for its fourth time, 120.5 to 114.5 over cross-town rival, DeLaSalle. Baker High School's duo of **Kenny Duplessis** and **Mitch Jackson** combined to defeat **John Calabero** and **Gordon Stuart**, both defending State Champions from DeLaSalle, in the finals at 119 and 126 pounds, respectively. The best

match of the meet, considered by many as the best match in the tournament's history, was in the 98 pound finals when sophomore, **Mitch Michelli** of Brother Martin, was leading **Craig Seals** of East Jefferson 7-0 with 1:20 remaining in the match. Seals escaped and took Michelli down to his back for the fall with 50 seconds left. Defending State Champ, **Jeff Tanguis** of Catholic, was selected the meet's Outstanding Wrestler.

East Jefferson High School of Metairie, coached by George Trygg, came into the sixth Invitational favored to beat defending champion Jesuit. They did just that as the Warriors finished 12.5 points ahead of Brother Martin. "Trygg's Chargers" placed seven wrestlers in the finals and won five titles. Out of those five, three went on to capture State titles (**Craig Seals** 105, **Keith Varmall** 112, and **Jim Ravannack** 145). **Tom Messonnier** of Brother Martin was the Outstanding Wrestler with his 6-4 decision over undefeated **David Albrecht** of East Jefferson.

In 1979, for the third year in a row, a new champion was crowned as Brother Martin won by 16 points over St. Benedict's of Newark, New Jersey, 139 to 123. The Crusaders, coached by Ray Charboneau, won four out

of five final matches (**Mitch Michelli**, **Tom Messonier**, **Troy Cross** and **Mark Roberts**) and got help from three place winners to capture the seventh Invitational. **Messonier** became the only wrestler to ever be selected Outstanding Wrestler twice, as he had three falls and a 12-0 decision over **John Daly** of St. Benedicts.

Again, 1980 had a new team champion in the most powerful and dominating team to ever wrestle in the Invitational: Booker T. Washington of Tulsa, Oklahoma coached by Ernie Jones. They won the Oklahoma State Tournament three years running and boasted the finest high school wrestler in the country in 145 pounder, **Kenny Monday**. Monday became the first four time

Oklahoma State Champion on his way to a 140-0-1 record. Washington set a team scoring record of 228 points with seven champions and four place winners. This was the first time the meet was held on two days. Monday was named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler with three falls and a 16-3 decision over undefeated **Mark Roberts** of Brother Martin.

The 1981 tournament was held to honor East Jefferson coach, George Trygg, who had been killed in an accident during the summer. Returning to the champions' throne room, after a three year absence, were the Blue Jays of Jesuit. With only two winners, the team had to rely heavily on the scoring of the seven place winners to beat Brother Martin 175.5 to 169.5 to secure their fifth title. Brother Martin had four champs and the Outstanding Wrestler in 155 pounder, **Larry Gibson** (three time State Champion twice in Kentucky and once in Louisiana). Gibson's match with Jeanerette's **Jerry Lewis** in the finals pitted two undefeated wrestlers against each other. Gibson, who fell behind in the first period, rallied with his lightning quick takedowns to win convincingly, 15-4.

The tenth annual tournament saw the field swell to 25 teams. The top two teams were, again, Jesuit and Brother Martin. They fought it down to the wire with Coach Sam's "Boys" winning 176 to 169. Jesuit didn't have a single winner but again relied on the consolation

matches to pick up the team's winning points. The biggest surprise of the meet was when unseeded **Rene Casadaban** of Brother Martin defeated Jesuit's top seed, Dennis Bertot, 9-7, in the semifinals and he then went on to beat undefeated **Eric Reeves** of St. Marks 9-8 in the finals. For his effort, Casadaban was selected the meet's Outstanding Wrestler.

Brother Martin High School — A New Dominance Emerges

The eleventh Invitational was expected to be a three way battle between favored Brother Martin, Holy Cross and R. L. Turner of Dallas, as they headed the field of 25 teams. Brother Martin entered the finals with a six point advantage over Turner and a nine point edge over Holy Cross. Holy Cross slipped ahead of Turner and Brother Martin edged out Holy Cross by nine points to win their second team title 191 to 182. State champion, Erik Ketelsen of Belaire coached by his father, Dale ex. Iowa State wrestler, won his first Lee title and went on to win his second state championship. This year also saw two wrestlers repeat as winners with Turner's **Chris Burrow** and **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross earning their second titles. **David Rowan**, 105 pounder from Holy Cross, was the meet's Outstanding Wrestler with his fall (1:02) of **Mario Villanueva** of Brother Martin in the finals.

The twelfth tournament had thirty-five teams represented and again it was the "Crescent City" schools fighting for first place. Brother Martin, the defending champions was the team to beat from the start of the tournament. With nine wrestlers placing and three making it to the finals with two champions, the Crusaders fell just eight points short of breaking Booker T. Washington's record for team points. Jesuit was a surprise second place finisher with nine place winners while Acadiana with three champions and the Outstanding Wrestler (112 pounder **Craig Clark**)

finished fourth. R. L. Turners **Chris Burrow** had four falls and a 10-4 decision to become the first three time winner in the tournaments history. **Klay Guillot** of Holy

Cross became the second three time winner a few minutes later when he won his 210 pound weight class. Out of eight State Champs entered only four won their weights. Burrow, Guillot, **Ken Spellman** of Brother Martin and **Sean Montgomery** of West Jefferson.

In 1985, thirty teams competed for individual and team honors. Defending Invitational Champion, Brother Martin, was the team to beat, as the Crusaders of Ray Charboneau brought 12 wrestlers with only 18 losses between them and four first place seeds. Martin was the defending State Champ of Louisiana, while R. L. Turner of Carrollton, Texas was the defending Texas State Champ, and Christian Brothers of Memphis, Tennessee was 3rd in the state of Tennessee. The field had five individual State Champs plus 16 undefeated wrestlers. The results of the 13th tournament were pretty much as

expected. Martin scored 171.5 points followed by East St. John with 145.5. **Adam Bob** of Northside was voted the Outstanding Wrestler as the result of his pinning three-time Lee Champ and three-time State Champ, **Klay Guillot** of Holy Cross 7-7, :26 OT in their 210 pound final. Two Brother Martin wrestlers reached the finals, but neither won and Martin became the third team to win without a single individual champion.

The 14th annual tournament in 1986 had Brother Martin winning its fourth consecutive title as it scored 215 point to outdistance the field of 29 teams. R. L. Turner was second with 130.5 points. The competition included four individual State Champions. Brother Martin Placed six in the finals and won three titles. The Outstanding Wrestler award went to third seeded **Dean Arevalo** of Bonnabel as he defeated **Chris Holmes** of Brother Martin 7-2 in the finals of the 102 pound class. After the award, Arevalo said he never expected to win the top honor and that he was so excited he could hardly speak.

In 1987, Brother Martin, the winner of three State Championships in a row and five State Crowns in the previous eight years, was the favorite team to defend its title. The Crusaders came in with two defending State Champs in **Greg Schmidt**, 13-0, and **Marc Davenport**, 17-0. When the smoke cleared, Martin won four individual titles along with its fifth team title and 208.5

points to finish ahead of Grace King, coached by Sam Sara, with 149 points. **Guy Mistretta** of Redemptorist, coached by his brother Craig, won his second Lee title and pushed his unbeaten streak to 82 in a row (his last loss was in the finals of the Lee tournament in 1985). Mistretta went on to capture three State Crowns. The Outstanding Wrestler award went to R. L. Turner's **Tommy Goodman**, a two time Texas State Champ, as he recorded five pins in route to his second Lee championship bringing his season record to 18-0 with 18 pins.

The tournament was not held in 1988.

The Blue Jays Are Back— Win The Next Six Out Of Seven

The meet went into its 16th year at Lee when 26 teams entered the field. Jesuit High School came in with three top seeds and scored a record 265 points. The Blue Jays placed eight wrestlers in the finals. Only three managed to secure the title led by two time State Champ **Spencer Harris**, at 145 pounds. The Jays outscored second place Comeaux by 100.5 points. Harris went on to capture his third State title. There were nine undefeated wrestlers at the start of the meet with only four surviving the tough two day competition. **Kerry Boumans** of Comeaux won his first Lee title and later captured his third State Championship. This year was also the first time since 1970 that the National Federation changed the weight classes. **Chris Guillot** of Holy Cross, at 130 pounds, was voted the Outstanding Wrestler by the coaches as he defeated Jesuit's **David LaFranca** 22-9 to push his record to 28-0. Coach Sam of Jesuit said, after the meet, "We were a little disappointed in the finals, but our kids did a good job to get to the finals and we were a little tired. But, you can't complain when you win by this much".

The 17th tournament in 1990 looked like Jesuit High School was the team to beat. After Friday's competition, Jesuit held the team lead with 82.5 points, followed by Brother Martin with 67.5 and Buras with 65 points. Martin had six in the semis, while Jesuit had only four. Jesuit won two Lee titles, but got a little scare from Don Gagnard's Comeaux team with one champ. Comeaux

finished 18 points behind the Jays. Martin dropped to third with 132.5 points. **Cloti Tate** of Baton Rouge High, coached by Robert Holder, recorded a 23-8 technical fall over Jesuit's **Clint Revet** and improved his record to 31-0. Tate was selected the Outstanding Wrestler of the meet and went on to capture the State championship.

Cloti Tate of Baton Rouge High was the lone State Champ entered in the 1991 tournament. There were eight undefeated wrestlers. Again, Jesuit was back to defend their Invitational title and was favored but was likely to get strong competition from Lafayette High School and Catholic, coached by former Brother Martin and three time State Champ, Ken Spellman. After Friday's competition, Catholic was in first place with 106 points followed by Brother Martin, Lafayette and Acadiana. Catholic held on to win its first Lee Invitational by finishing ten points ahead of Lafayette. Tournament favorite, Jesuit, was fifth. The Bears had only one individual champion in **Dan Zvonek** at 135 pounds. Five of the eight undefeated wrestlers remained unbeaten. Riverdale's **Harold Boudreaux, Jr.**, coached by his father was voted the Outstanding Wrestler in the 18th annual Invitational with his 12-5 win over previously undefeated **Mike Revere** (23-0) of Lafayette.

The 19th annual Lee Invitational was Jesuit's stepping stone to setting a team scoring record of 269 points, with five individual champions to outdistance Catholic High by 56.5 points. The Blue Jays captured their ninth team title under Coach "Sam". One outstanding match in the finals was at 103 pounds. Jesuit's **Rene Baumer** avenged his lone loss to Tara's **Ben Kristonis** (21-0). Baumer defeated Kristonis at his own game of takedowns and won 7-3. **Murat Akdmar**, third seed from Jesuit, a sixth place finisher in 1991, was voted the Outstanding Wrestler via his defeat of second seeded **Michael Weber** of Catholic (16-4), and his pinning of first seeded **J. J. Fletcher** of Acadiana in the finals in a time of 3:56. Three wrestlers went on to win their second State title: Tara's **Brad Goudeau**; Catholic's **Dan Zvonek**; and Jesuit's **Mike Hanemann**. At the tournament this year, we missed long time friend and wrestling colleague Ken Cole, due to his untimely death during the prior summer.

The results of the twentieth annual tournament, with a

field of 38 teams plus W. A. Berry from Birmingham, Alabama, was no surprise as Coach Sam Harnsongkram's

Jesuit Sets Tournament Scoring Record Of 277.5 Points Along With Their Tenth Title

Jesuit Blue Jays won their second consecutive Lee High Invitational and their tenth overall title scoring 277.5 points. Catholic High, coached by Kenny Spellman was a distant second with 120 points followed closely by Steve Lotef's Northside squad with 114 points and Grace King team of Coach Sam Sara with 113 points.

Jesuit High School, the New Orleans team on Carrollton Avenue, had five individual winners and six place winners to again set the tournament team scoring record. Two-time state champion **Mike Hanemann** boosted his season record to 24-0 with his five first period falls on this way to his second Lee title and the Outstanding Wrestler Award. This year, five wrestlers won their second Lee Invitational title: **Rene Baumer** and **Mike Hanemann** of Jesuit; **Jonathan Schudmak** of Grace King; **Shane Colomb** of Lafayette; and **Coleman Ruiz** of Holy Cross—considered by many coaches to be the “most physical wrestler in the tournament.”

Ten wrestlers came to Lee with undefeated records and six left that way (**Paige Russell-Belaire**, 34-0; **Rene Baumer**-Jesuit, 18-0; **Mike Hanemann**-Jesuit, 24-0; **Sean Grilletta**-Jesuit, 25-0; **Coleman Ruiz**-Holy Cross 32-0 and Istrouma's **Robert Walker**, 13-0). If you had been seeded first or second, then you would have won the tournament, as eight first and five second place seeds won titles. The finals saw two matches go into overtime to decide the winner. First-seeded **Mike Babineaux** of Northside scored a reversal in the second period of overtime to defeat previously undefeated **Paul Walker** of Catholic 8-6 for the 103 pound title. Then in the 135 title bout, second-seeded **Richard Barnett** of Jesuit handed Brusly's **Payton Schouest** his first loss of the season with a takedown in the first period of overtime to win 11-9.

Thirty eight teams competed in the 21st tournament which was won by Coach Sam Harnsongkram's Jesuit

Blue Jays for the fifth time in six years. The "Jays" with two champions and eight place winners, outdistanced a solid Northside team by 51 points. Northside from Lafayette, coached by Stephen Lotief, had four individual champions. Jesuit brought only 12 wrestlers to the tournament but with only a combined total of 14 losses between them. Ten of those 12 wrestlers went on to place and score 238 points to claim the tournament

championship. **Rene Baumer** became only the third wrestler to win three Lee titles but had his hands full with Alabama state champion **Stewart Holt** of W. A. Berry. Baumer won a close 5-4 decision. Catholic's **Seamas Dore'** was selected by a vote of the coaches as the meets Outstanding Wrestler with his 13-5 decision over **Chance Deranger** of Northside for his second Lee title. Dore' later went on to fracture his foot at practice and never got back to his championship form by the state tournament but still placed sixth at states. Northside's **Mike Babineaux** remained undefeated and captured his second title with his 17-7 victory in the 112 pound finals. Babineaux a junior has a chance at becoming a three time Lee winner in 1995. Nine wrestlers came to Lee with perfect records, but when the smoke cleared only six of them remained that way. Eight state champions were featured in the meet lead by Division I two-time state champ **Ben Kristonis** of Tara, Jesuit's **Rene Baumer**, **Mike Babineaux** of Northside, along with Division II three-time state champ **Joey Cortez** of Basile, two-time champ **Brad Macha** of Redemptorist, **Taun Nguyen** of Buras, and Tara's **Brad Johnson** (formally of Bishop Sullivan). **Stewart Holt** of W. A. Berry was the defending Alabama state champion.

The 1995 edition of the Lee High Invitational Tournament was the first time the meet was moved to a neutral site away from the Lee High campus. The Morris C. Plotts Complex on the grounds of the Jimmy Swaggard Ministries provided a bigger mat area with less crowding and better parking. The facilities were top notch and with the field of 39 teams competing for honors, the tournament was a huge success. L.H.S.A.A. adopted the new weights for the 1994-95 season so therefore we were using the new weights for the tournament this year.

But, business as usual, defending champion Jesuit High School had the team title wrapped up before the final

round of the tournament started. The New Orleans-based power used its depth to pile up points early as the "Blue Jays" had just one individual champion, 275 pound **John Culver**. Jesuit had 10 place winners out of the thirteen weight classes plus 32 falls out of their 58 matches to compile 242 points and finish ahead of second place Catholic High school. The race was really for second place as Grace King, Comeaux and Rummel were all in striking distance of second place.

A total of 13 state champions were entered in the tournament (7 Div. I, 5 Div. II, 1 Alab.) with 14 wrestlers having undefeated records. **Mike Babineaux** of

Northside became only the fourth wrestler to capture three Lee titles. Grace King's **Chad Phillips** was voted by the coaches as the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler with his pin in the finals of the 151 pound weight class. Five Division II wrestlers made it to the finals with three winning titles. Those three (**Patrick Luke** of Hanson, **Tuan Nguyen** of Buras, and **Brad Macha** of Redemptorist) also won their weight classes at the Louisiana State Championships held at UNO Health & PE Center. McKinley's **Larry Batiste** won his second Lee title with his close 16-15 decision over **Brian Veprek** of Jesuit while going on to his second state championship. **Chad Boudreaux** of Rummel, **Ryan Hess** (3) of Holy Cross and **Korak Simmons** of DeLaSalle all won state championships.

The 1996 edition of the Lee Invitational had a new champion in Brother Martin High School coached by Mark Wisniewski (a Lee finalist in '81) and Robbie Dautrive. The Crusaders had not won the tournament since 1987 which was dominated by Jesuit High School at that time. Martin had nine of their 14 wrestlers place in the top six to run away with the team title, scoring 216 points to runner-up Jesuit which had 193 points. Hoover High School, coached by ex-Auburn wrestler Duke

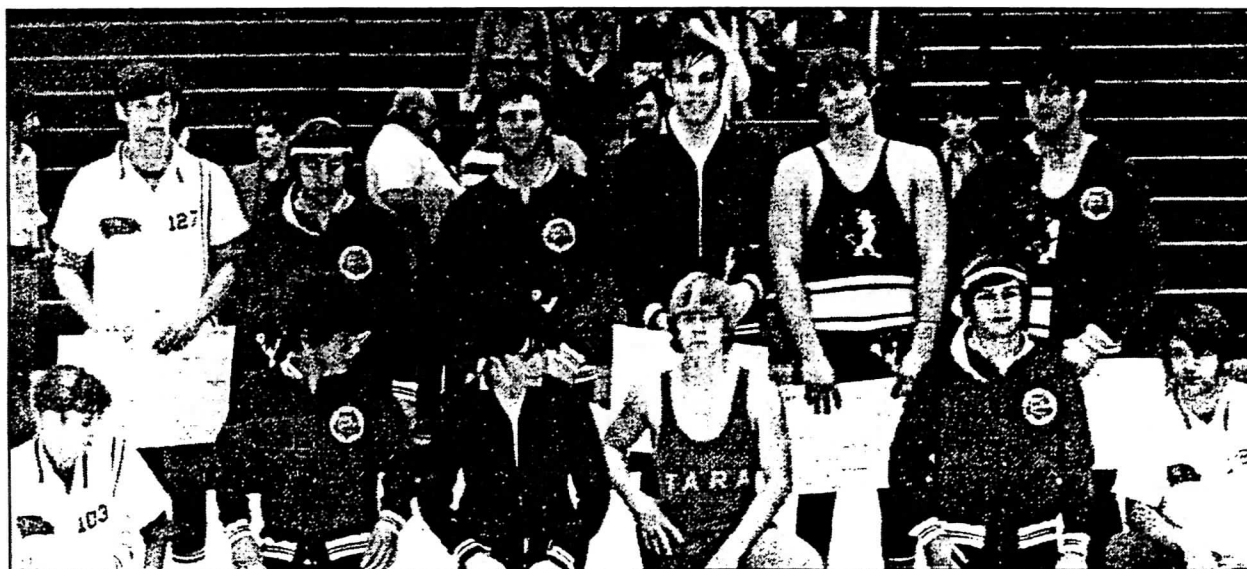
Cheminto, from Hoover, Alabama, was third with 170 points out of a record field of 44 teams. Brother Martin had five wrestlers reach the finals with only **Jacob Gruwell** winning a title. In one of the best matches of the tournament, **Chad Broudeaux** of Rummel decisively defeated McKinley's **Roderick Ratcliff** 7-6 for his second Lee title, and for his efforts **Boudreaux** was

named the tournament's Outstanding Wrestler. **Patrick Luke** of Hanson Memorial in Franklin won his second title also, and both **Boudreaux** and **Luke** have a chance to become three time winners in this year's meet. Another match that was highly anticipated was in the 189 pound finals with two state champs, both with unblemished records on the line. **Daniel Cormier** of Northside defeated St. Paul's **Matt Fresch** 13-5 for his first Lee title. Fourteen wrestlers entered the competition without losses on their records, but only five left undefeated. From the championship finals of a year ago 12 wrestlers won either Division I or II State titles. Jesuit came back strong at the state tournament, held at UNO Lakefront Arena and defeated the Crusaders by 199.5 to 194 for their 16th state title. Along with **Luke**, **Gruwell**, **Boudreaux**, and **Cormier** two other wrestlers will be back to defend their titles—**Matt Orillion** of Jesuit and **Dennis Parker** of Catholic.

The 24th annual tournament had few surprises in the way of the team champion as Jesuit set a tournament scoring record 280.5 points, surpassing the 1993 record of 277.5

points by the Blue Jays. The Blue Jays placed seven wrestlers in the finals with **Creighton Mullins** and **Jason Leckert** winning individual titles to lead Jesuit to its fifth Lee title in six years. Brother Martin was a distant second. **Chad Boudreaux** of Rummel won his third consecutive Lee title and became the fifth wrestler to accomplish this feat in 24 years. Rummel teammate **Patrick Ritchie** defeated Hanson's two-time champion **Patrick Luke** in their 119 pound final match to earn the Outstanding Wrestler award for the tournament. The finals saw eleven weight classes where the first and second seeds met head-to head. Brother Martin's **Jacob Gruwell** successfully defended his title along with **Dennis Parker** of Catholic and **Daniel Cormier** of Northside to become two-time Lee champions. The Lee winners to go on to win Div. I State titles were **Leon Ngchee**-Grace King, **Mullins**-Jesuit, **Richie**-Runnel (2), **Roderick Ratcliff**-McKinley (2), **Boudreaux**-Rummel (3), **Gruwell**-Br. Martin (2), **Leckert**-Jesuit, **Parker**-Catholic, **Cormier**-Northside (3), and **Roxie Shelvin**-Franklin. The Div. II State Champions were **Wyman Alligood**-Buras, **Luke**-Hanson (3), **Josh Friedman**-Buras (2), **Josh Fontenot**-Bishop Sullivan (2), and **Bryan Seymour**-Brusly. Considering the fact that Jesuit had only three seniors and 11 underclassmen, the domination of the tournament becomes even more impressive. One great match was in the 152 pound finals with **Josh Fontenot** of Bishop Sullivan being down 5-0 to **Trey Landry** of Jesuit in the first period and coming back to tie the score 5-5 at the end of the second period. **Fontenot** then scored on a reversal and caught **Landry** on his back and secured the fall in 5:17 to win Bishop Sullivan's first Lee title.

Only six different teams have won the tournament in the last 24 years.

Jesuit (13), Brother Martin (7), Lee, East Jefferson, B.T. Washington and Catholic all one time each.

Jesuit High School in New Orleans, under the coaching of Coach Sam Harnsongkram has won 13 team championships, been runner-up twice and has had the most individual champions with 48.

Brother Martin of New Orleans, has the next most team titles with seven (five in a row) and three runner-up spots.

Brother Martin also is second in total individual titles with 26, followed by Catholic with 22 and Holy Cross with eighteen.

Fifty-three different schools have won an individual title.

St. Benedict's Clarence Richardson of Newark, New Jersey, while wrestling for L.S.U. set the quick pin record in the N.C.A.A. tournament.

Three wrestlers that won the tournament were coached by their fathers Erik Ketelsen-Dale Ketelsen 1983 Belaire, Jim Wentzell-Chuck Wentzell 1985-Sulphur, Harold Bourgeois Jr.-Harold Bourgeois 1991-Riverdale.

Only five wrestlers have won the tournament three times: Chris Burrows-R.L. Turner 1982-84, Klay Guillot-Holy Cross 1982-84, Rene Baumer- Jesuit 1992-94, Mike Babineaux-Northside 1993-95 and Chad Boudreaux-Rummel 1995-97.

Three coaches are tied at four each with their wrestlers garnering the Outstanding Wrestler Award: Sam Harnsongkram-Jesuit, Ed Kavanaugh-Holy Cross and Ray Charboneau-Brother Martin.

There has only been one wrestler to win the Outstanding Wrestler Award twice: Tom Messonnier - Brother Martin

Eleven sets of brothers have won the tournament.

Adam Bob of Northside probably had the biggest upset in the tournaments history when he pinned in overtime three-time Lee Champion and three-time state champion Klay Guillot to stop his bid for an unprecedented four Lee titles.

Another match ranked up as one of the tournaments best was last year in the 119 pound finals where Rummel's Division I state champ Patrick Richie stopped Hanson's two time Division II state champ Patrick Luke in his bid for a third individual title by the score of 6-5 to earn him the Outstanding Wrestler Award in the 24th Tournament.

Seven Invitationals have be won by 10 or less points, with the closest margin of victory coming in 1974 by Lee with its .5 point victory over Holy Cross. The largest margin of victory was by Jesuits High School in 1993 with its 157 point difference over Catholic.

Winning team with the most champions: B.T. Washington - 7 Titles

Winning team with the least number of champions: 0— Lee - 1974; Jesuit - 1982; and Brother Martin - 1985.

Colothdian Tate of Baton Rouge High and Ben Kritsonis of Tara both won Junior Collge National Championships. Tate also won the Big-8 Conference title for Iowa State.

If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round, he shall be awarded 2 advancement points for that round if he wins his next match. No points are awarded for the bye if the wrestler loses his next match.

1 point shall be scored for each match won in the consolation elimination, except for the final third and fifth place matches. A wrestler who has a bye in the consolation round shall receive one advancement point, provided he wins his next match.
